The Festival of San Salvatore and an ancient Sicilian Celebration

On August 6th, Cefalú celebrates San Salvatore, its patron saint. This annual festival in the Sicilian city features processions, celebrations, and traditional dishes like "Pasta a Taianu" which is made with meat, tomatoes, eggplant, and pecorino cheese.

The festival's history is closely linked to the Duomo di Cefalú, a UNESCO World Heritage Site built during the Norman era. The festivities center around the Christ Pantocrator, an image of Jesus that appears on the festival flag and remains above the cathedral throughout the event.

Each day brings new events, including concerts, firework displays, and food vendors. On the final day, crowds gather in the harbor to watch the "Ntinna a mari" competition. This traditional game involves 17 boys or men from fishing families of Cefalú who must walk on a 16-meter-long wooden beam, fixed to the pier and made smooth with animal fat, to catch the flag on its end, which depicts the face of the patron saint.

The "Ntinna a mari" embodies Cefalú's culture, highlighting values like religiosity, brotherhood, warmth, cheerfulness, and respect for traditions.



THE COLOR OF SUMMER



The color of summer is here, and it started with a chocolate bar. Pistachio (both the food and the color) is all the rage right now. The nut entered the limelight over the past several months after various food creators popularized "Dubai chocolate," an indulgent chocolate bar filled with pistachio cream, tahini, and shredded phyllo dough. Now, pistachio is everywhere! You can find it in ice cream, coffee, cookies, salad, martini's and tiramisu just to name a few.

The Bronte pistachio collection, a community celebration, embodies the pride of belonging to a generous land.

Renowned for their superior quality and economic and cultural value, Bronte's pistachios, known as 'green gold,' flourished in Sicily centuries ago during Arab domination.

Bronte's farmers have perfected cultivation and harvesting techniques, passing down knowledge and traditions through generations. This has earned the Bronte pistachio an international reputation for excellence.

One of the pistachio's peculiarities is its two-year harvest cycle. During this rest period, the plant accumulates energy, ensuring a high-quality harvest in the following year. During the 'dumping' year, the plants don't bear fruit, but farmers still care for them by pruning trees and maintaining the soil, preparing it for the next harvest. This two-year cycle is why the pistachio of Bronte is so appreciated: patience and care yield fruit with intense flavor and superior quality.

The harvest period varies from year to year due to climate and location, typically beginning in mid-August and lasting until early September. Despite modern technology, the collection of pistachios in Bronte remains entirely manual due to the uneven and challenging lava soil. Pickers use canvas bags or plastic baskets to collect the nuts, though upside-down umbrellas under tree branches served as 'nets' in the past. Manual harvesting remains a distinctive element of pistachio production.

After harvesting, pistachios undergo 'smallatura,' a process that removes the outer hull using specialized machines. Shelled pistachios are then dried in the sun or under ventilated tunnels for 5-6 days to preserve their quality. Once dried, they're stored in warehouses awaiting shelling, which can take months and is scheduled based on market needs to ensure a steady supply of fresh, high-quality nuts.

Bronte pistachios are processed into various food products beyond simple dried fruit. They're the main ingredient in spreads, ice creams, desserts, and even sausages.

In Sicily, pistachios are the star of traditional sweets like cannoli and refreshing Sicilian granita. Beyond desserts, the pistachio di Bronte is increasingly used in savory dishes like pesto's, pasta condiments, and bruschetta. Its rich flavor enhances various dishes, making it a valuable kitchen ingredient.

The Bronte pistachio collection, a vital part of the local economy and a centuriesold tradition, is cultivated with patience and skill, making it a true Sicilian treasure. The harvest celebration strengthens the bond between the land and its people,



showcasing the passion, tradition, and innovation that goes into every aspect of pistachio production, from planting to dish.

Fun Facts About Italy

The name Italy comes from the word Italia, meaning "calf land," perhaps because the bull was a symbol of the southern Italian tribes.

When McDonald's opened in Rome in 1986, food purists outside the restaurant gave away free spaghetti to remind people of their culinary heritage.

The pre-dinner passeggiata or evening stroll is one of Italy's enduring activities where Italians stroll about the streets to see and be seen.

When European Jews were being persecuted during WWII, it was not unusual for some Jews to hide in Italy's ancient catacombs.

Influenced in part by the French flag, the Italian flag has evolved over several hundred years. The flag's colors are green, white and red representing hope, faith and charity.

A Dream Come True by Fred Pitella

I was asked once "what is a Giglio?" A Giglio is a tower erected to honor a Saint. Standing over 70 feet tall and weighing approximately 4 tons, it requires the collective effort of around 120 individuals to lift, carry, and dance with it down the street while a band plays on its platform. This tradition, an Italian American custom in Brooklyn spanning over a century, holds a special place in my heart.

Growing up in Brooklyn, my father would always take us to the feast, and it was my mother's favorite. I would often dream of one day being a part of the procession and carrying the Giglio.

My dream finally came true when I recently participated in the Our Lady of Mt. Carmel feast in Brooklyn. I was honored and exhausted as I proudly carried the Giglio. The Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Feast, a traditional NYC Italian Street Festival, offers food vendors, rides, and games for families. Since 1887, the Italian American community has celebrated their faith, culture, and family traditions on Williamsburg's streets. Each July, revelers from all over participate in the Dancing of the Giglio, a centuries-old tradition.



For twelve days, the streets surrounding the Shrine Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel transform into a vibrant festival with food vendors, rides, games, and daily entertainment. The beloved feast has been an integral part of the community since 1887, when immigrants from Southern Italy brought their cherished celebrations to America. Over the years, it has preserved many old-world traditions while adapting to life in the United States.

In the late 19th century, Italian immigrants from Nola settled in Williamsburg, Brooklyn. Devoted to their faith, especially their patron saint, San Paolino, they formed the Società M.S. San Paolino to honor San Paolino. In 1903, they organized the inaugural Giglio Feast in Brooklyn. For over five decades, the society, in collaboration with The San Paolo Society, has organized the feast, preserving their hometown tradition in their new country. In the 1950s, the festival's leadership transitioned to The Shrine Church of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, which merged the Giglio Feast with the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Since then, it's been celebrated annually in July, culminating on July 16th, the feast

day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. This fusion of traditions creates a unique celebration that harmonizes religious, cultural, and community elements.


In contemporary Brooklyn, the Giglio Feast continues this centuries-old tradition. The centerpiece is the magnificent Giglio adorned with flowers, saints, and angels. The event is filled with music, dance, and a spirit that evokes the old neighborhood traditions.

The Giglio Feast is a must-do in Brooklyn! It brings together generations of Italian Americans and welcomes folks from all walks of life. It's a celebration of history, devotion, and lively festivities. The next day, my shoulder was so sore I had trouble lifting my coffee cup! But it was totally worth it! As I was lifting the Giglio, I felt my Mom and Dad smiling down on me!

How Popes spend their summer vacations

Leo XIV is taking some well-deserved time off to kick back and relax after all the hubbub surrounding his election in May as the first North American Pope.

The newly pegged pontiff recently rode out the July heat in **Castel Gandolfo**, the traditional holiday residence of

popes dating back to the 16th century. According to *The Guardian*, he's slated to return in mid-August.

The sprawling complex and gardens of Castel Gandolfo, built on the ruins of an ancient Roman villa, is located about an hour south of Rome in the lakeside town of the same name.

According to *Vatican News*, the property was acquired by the Holy See in 1596 from a noble Roman family, and finally incorporated into its assets in 1604. It was Pope Urban VII who ordered the transformation into an apostolic summer digs, becoming the first pontiff in history to "vacay" there.

The tradition of popes taking breaks outside of blisteringly hot Rome endured until Leo's predecessor, Pope Francis (who famously shunned pomp and privilege) declined to use it, opting for humble "staycations" in his papal apartment in Rome.

As a result, Castel Gandolfo was opened to the public in 2016, allowing visitors to roam its Renaissance-era gardens and take a peek into some of the opulent rooms inside the estate.

The palace will continue to be a museum, with Leo spending his holiday in a renovated Villa Barberini — a relatively smaller estate next door, boasting views of Lake Albano, along with gardens, olive groves, orchards, and a paved stone walkway. Not bad.




